



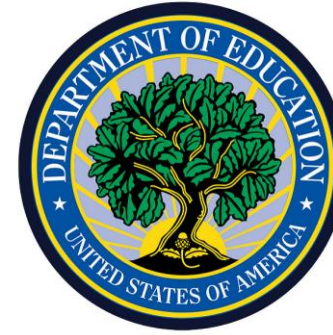

# Purpose

- ▶ All Title I schools are required to hold an Annual Title I Parent meeting to explain and discuss the Title I Schoolwide program and requirements.
- ▶ Treutlen Elementary & Treutlen Middle/High are *Schoolwide* Title I schools.



# What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federally funded program for elementary, middle & high schools.

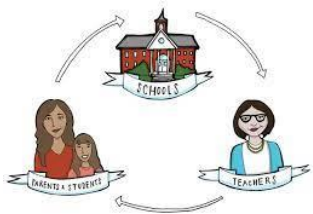


Through Title I, money is given to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district.



# What is Title I?

Each district has discretion regarding the use of their Title I funds.



Title I exists to help students, teachers, and parents.



# What is Title I ?

- Through Title I programs children do better in school and feel better about themselves
- The focus of the Title I program is on helping ALL students meet the same high academic standards expected of all children



# The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Title I Parent and Family Engagement Requirements

- ▶ If the district's Title I allocation is \$500,000 or more, the School District and all Title I schools must allocate at least one percent (1%) of their Title I budget towards programs, activities and procedures for parent and family engagement.
- ▶ The School District and all Title I schools must develop and distribute to parents a copy of the Title I Parent and Family Engagement Plan.

- ▶ All Title I schools are required to collaborate with parents in the development of the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and Parent-School Compact.

# Program Funds

- Treutlen County School District receives approximately **\$600,000** in Title I funds
- Title I Parent & Family Engagement funds set aside this year: **\$25,000**



## Parents Have the Right...

- ▶ To request and receive timely information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals.
- ▶ To know if their child is assigned to, or taught, for four(4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet the district's professional qualifications and/or state certification requirements for the grade level or subject area taught.
- ▶ To know the level of achievement of their child in each area of the state assessment



## Parents Have the Right...

- ▶ To be involved in the planning and implementation of the parent involvement program in their school
- ▶ To provide input regarding the 1% set-aside for Parental Involvement

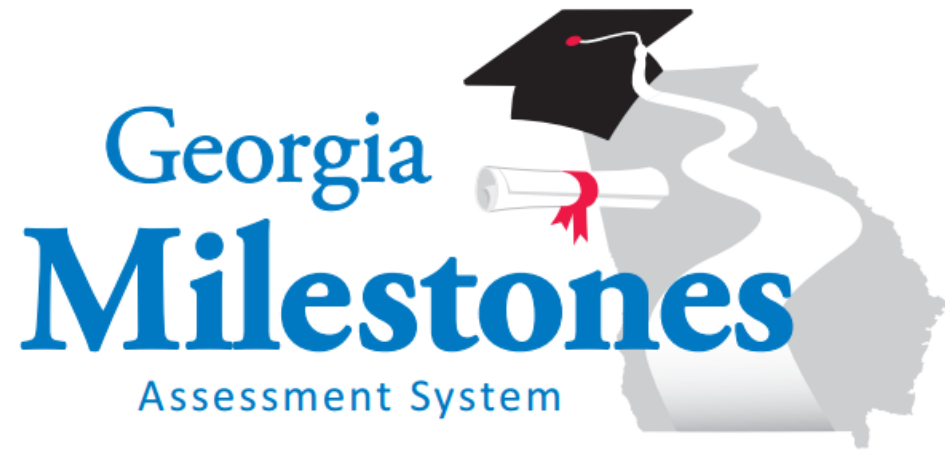

# Assessments



## NWEA MAP

The NWEA MAP Test (Measures of Academic Progress) is an **adaptive achievement and growth test**. It creates a personalized assessment experience by adapting to each student's learning level—precisely measuring progress and growth for each individual student.



## School Improvement Status

- Based on data from 2019, TMHS was identified as Targeted Support Improvement (TSI) status
- Students with Disability (SWD) subgroup was performing in the lowest 5% in all CCRPI components. *Due to COVID, this status has not been updated.*



# TES School Improvement Goals/Strategies:

- Increase the percentage of students from 46% to 50% scoring at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile on NWEA MAP in ELA
- Increase the percentage of students from 42% to 45% scoring at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile on the NWEA MAP in mathematics
- Address the social emotional needs of students

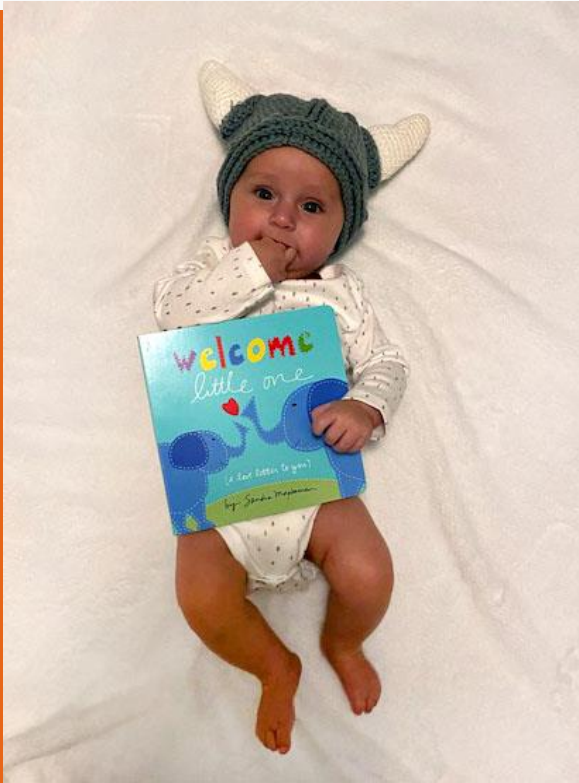

# Birth to 4 Literacy

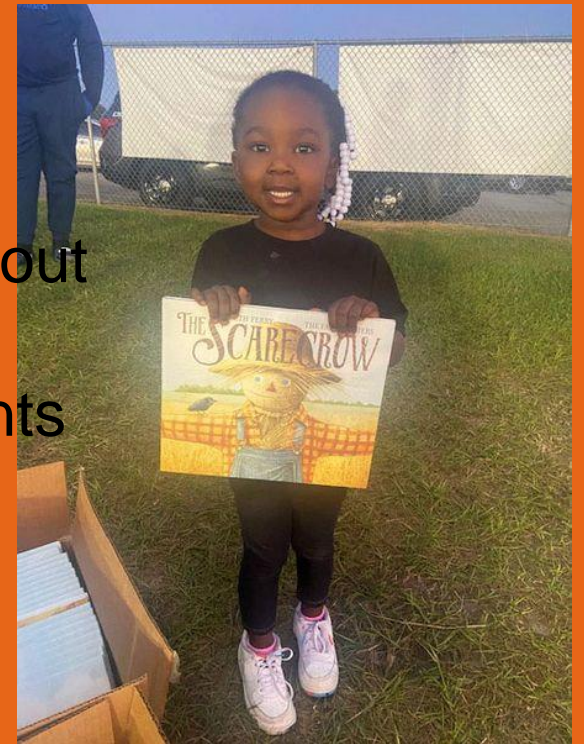


**Baby Viking Book Club-** Starting children out right.

Newborns receive a book, beanie, and a letter from the superintendent.

We will begin working with nurseries and Headstart to train employees in phonemic awareness and strategies to jumpstart early learning.

Books are also given out at football games and other community events to promote literacy.



# Eureka Math

We continue with Eureka math. Our fourth grades saw some of the highest scores in the ten district RESA last year.

# Social Emotional Learning

Mindset Monday-

Every Monday morning teachers and students engage in social emotional learning lessons to discuss issues such as self-confidence, conflict resolution and reinforce our Viking Values.

*Do You Know Enough About Me to Teach Me*

All teachers and staff completed a book study to add to their awareness of students' social and emotional needs.

# TMHS School Improvement Goals

- To increase NWEA MAP High Growth/High Achievement from 29.70% to 32.79% in Reading and 11.63% to 14.63% in Math
- To increase the 2020 4 year cohort graduation rate percentage from 80% to 83% in 2021.
