District and School Academic Goals

As a schoolwide program the overarching goal is to improve the entire educational program in all schools which should result in improving the academic achievement of all students, particularly the lowest achieving students.

- All schools will increase the percentage of students reading at or above the 50th percentile by 10% as measured by the midpoint of the Grade Level lexile band on this year's NWEA MAP

 - Increase the percentage of students from 38% to 50% scoring at or above the 50th percentile on the NWEA MAP in reading and language
- GOALS2
 - Increase the percentage of students from 21% to 38% scoring at or above the 50th percentile on the NWEA MAP in mathematics

 - Implement structures to improve school culture and student experiences



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Treutlen High School Goals/Academic Focus:

 - Increase the percentage of students from 41% to 50% scoring at or above the 50th percentile on the NWEA MAP in reading and 39% to 50% scoring above the 50th percentile on the NWEA MAP in Language (9th and 10th)
